COMPLETING THE PARENTING PLAN, PARENT- CREATED Joint Legal and Joint Physical Custody

IMPORTANT: Use of the Joint Legal And Joint Physical Custody Parenting Plan is intended <u>only</u> for those cases in which:

 Both parents voluntarily and willingly agree to share joint legal custody of the child(ren) (decision-making).

and

• Both parents voluntarily and willingly agree to share joint physical custody of the child(ren) (where the children live and parenting time).

This sample plan is <u>only a guide</u>. You must consider your own situation and develop a parenting plan that works for both of the parents and your children.

This parenting plan will list the amount of time the children will live with each parent. It will also list how holidays and special days will be shared.

- If you want items in your parenting plan that are not in this sample, you can add them.
- If you do not want items in your parenting plan that are in this sample, you can take them out.
 - For example, you may want to add or remove some holidays;
 - Change time periods, the method of pick up, and return times for parenting time;
 - Change the length of time for summer parenting time, etc.
 - If you observe other holidays that are not included in this sample, you can add language to your plan about those.

This is your parenting plan, and it should meet your individual needs.

- The parenting plan provides a legal "fall back" plan for parents to use if there is a need.
- The parents can informally or temporarily change the terms of this plan as long as they both agree to it. However, if there is a disagreement, the details in this plan control the parenting time.
- This plan may be formally changed if both parents agree to it in writing. The parents understand that any permanent changes must be approved by the court to be binding and enforceable.

REMEMBER: your parenting plan will be reviewed by the judge and will need to be court ordered before it takes legal effect.

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If you are printing the form and handwriting the answer, check the first box. If you are completing the form on the computer, check the second box.

This section outlines how the parents will share their parenting time with the children.

There are two pre-set options and a third choice that allows you to describe the details of a plan you and the other party have created.

If you create your own, the schedule needs to be very specific and give details showing that one parent or the other has responsibility for the children at all times, seven (7) days a week, 24 hours a day. On the lines provided, describe the details of the parent-created parenting time. If more space is needed, include more page(s).

Priority of Holiday Parenting Time Schedules: Holiday parenting time schedule takes priority over the regular parenting time schedule. (Check the box that applies): The regular weekend parenting schedule will skip the holiday and be carried forward to the weekend following. As an example, suppose the plaintiff's regular weekend parenting time with the child(ren) falls during the Labor Day holiday in a year when the child(ren) is/are with the defendant for Labor Day. The parents agree to the following exchange plan:

- 13. Being on Time. Both parents understand that they have the responsibility to be on time. If either parent will be late for some reason, or will be unable to exercise parenting time, that parent will notify the other parent as soon as possible. The parents understand that fifteen (15) minutes is a reasonable time for a parent to wait in order to pick up or return the child(ren).
- Scheduling Activities. One parent may not plan or schedule activities during the parenting time of the other parent without reasonable notice to and consent of the other parent.
- 15. Child(ren)'s Events. The parents will inform each other, reasonably in advance, of all events where a parent may participate in the child(ren)'s activities or events (i.e., school plays, athletic events, teacher conferences, music recitals, and the like). Notice will be provided in such a way that the other parent has the maximum opportunity to attend that activity or event.
- 16. Parenting Behavior. The child(ren)'s best interests require the utmost cooperation between the parents. To this end, neither parent will talk badly about or in any way be negative about the other parent in front of the child(ren) or in any activity or communication involving the child(ren). Neither parent will ask about the other's personal affairs through the child(ren). The parents will cooperate with each other, to the fullest extent necessary, in order to encourage a safe, secure, and loving environment for the child(ren).
- 17. Access to Information. Each parent shall continue to have full and equal access to the education and medical records of the minor child(ren). The names of both parents will appear on all school, governmental, law enforcement, medical and health-related records, and both parents will be provided full and equal access to all teachers, government officials and doctors.
- Emergency Medical. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the minor child(ren) while the child(ren) is/ are in the physical custody of such parent.
- Temporary Changes. The parents can temporarily change the terms of this Plan as long as they both agree to it.

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- Permanent Changes. This Plan may be changed by mutual, written agreement of the parents. Both parents understand that any permanent changes must be approved by the court to be binding and enforceable.
- Mediation for Future Disputes. In the event one or both of the parents wish to change the terms of this Plan in the future and the parents are unable to agree on the terms of such change, the parents will attempt to mediate their disagreements.
- 22. Notification Requirement for Current and Change of Address and Contact Information. If there is a change of address or contact information, each parent will notify the other parent by mailing the change of address to the last known mailing address. Exception: If one parent has a confidential address under Nebraska or federal law, the address or return address shall only include the county and state for a party who is living or moving to an undisclosed location.
- Out-of-State Change of Residence. The child(ren)'s residence will not be changed from the State of Nebraska without prior order of the court.
